## ABOUT PARTNER ABUSE

Consider the following facts about domestic violence/partner abuse in LGBT communities:

- Approximately 1 out of every 4 lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender (LGBT) people will be abused by an intimate partner.
- The frequency/severity of abuse in LGBT relationships is about the same as in heterosexual relationships.
- In small communities, the survivor's support system is often the same as the abuser's, making it difficult to know who to turn to for help.
- The threat of "outing" can be as serious as a death threat, with the potential to jeopardize the survivor's job, children, housing and social support.
- LGBT survivors are dealing with the effects of domestic violence at the same time as they deal with other forms of oppression, such as homophobia, heterosexism, transphobia, sexism and racism.
